

# J. Ross Woods Memorial Music Scholarship

Administered by Lewiston Independent Foundation for Education, Inc.

## (Trust Fund endowed scholarship)

- ESTABLISHED: J. Ross Woods was the high school and junior high band and orchestra instructor from 1936 until his retirement in 1968. In those 32 years he never missed a single day of work. His wife established the scholarship following his death in 1985.
- AMOUNT: One \$1,000 scholarship for the first year of college. It will be paid in halves, \$500 for each semester.
- TERM: One year scholarship only. Must be used during the fall and spring semesters immediately following graduation from LHS. If the recipient is unable to use the scholarship, it will be awarded to a qualified alternate.
- USE: Scholarship may be used for tuition, fees, room or board at the University of Idaho. Student may incur tax liability for any amount applied to room and board.
- ELIGIBILITY: Any Lewiston High School graduating senior may apply for this scholarship who meets the following eligibility criteria:
1. Applicant must have participated in instrumental music education or activities while attending LHS;
  2. Applicant must intend to pursue a college program in music at the University of Idaho.
- APPLICATION DEADLINE: Completed application should be submitted to the LHS Counselors in the College & Career Counseling Center **by April 15. If this date falls on a weekend, the application is due on Monday.**
